EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE)

Food (Meat)

THE MEAT (ADDITION OF PRESERVATIVE) ORDER, 1941.  
DATED SEPTEMBER 10, 1941.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation 55 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, as amended, and of all other powers him enabling, the Minister of Food hereby makes the following Order:—

1. In this Order:—

“ Meat ” includes any description of meat or edible offal specified in the Schedule to the Meat (Prescribed Wholesale Prices) Order, 1940(a), as amended(b), or in the Schedules to the Meat (Maximum Retail Prices) Order, 1940(c), as amended(d).

“ The Minister ” means the Minister of Food.

“ Preservative ” means sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>).

2. Except under the authority of the Minister and in accordance with any directions given by him or on his behalf, no person shall add to any meat or treat any meat with, or cause or permit any other person to add to any meat or treat any meat with, preservative.

3. It shall be lawful for any person subject to the provisions of this Order or of any other Order made by the Minister to sell or offer or agree to sell or expose for sale or to deposit in any place for the purposes of sale any meat to which has been added, or which has been treated with, preservative under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 hereof.

4. Infringements of this Order are offences against the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939.

5. This Order shall come into force on the 15th day of September, 1941, and may be cited as the Meat (Addition of Preservative) Order, 1941.
