SIR,

Labelling of Food (Amendment) Regulations, 1958

1. I am directed by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food to enclose for the information of your Authority a copy of the Labelling of Food (Amendment) Regulations, 1958, which he has made jointly with the Minister of Health.

2. These regulations revoke Article 8 (*d*) of the Labelling of Food Order (S.I. 1953 No. 536, as amended) thereby removing the requirement that no liquor shall be labelled as a cocktail or as a mixture containing spirits unless it contains not less than 40 per cent proof spirit. Such liquors will still be subject to the provisions of Article 4 (4) of the Order which requires them to be labelled with a declaration of alcohol content.

3. A copy of this circular and the regulations is being sent to the Medical Officer of Health and a copy is enclosed for the sampling officer. Further copies may be obtained from Her Majesty's Stationery Office.
